ACCESSIBILITY

Bloemfontein is easily accessible through South Africa's major international airports located in the cities of Johannesburg, Cape Town and Durban with:

- 10 direct flights a day from Johannesburg
- 2 direct flights a day from Cape Town
- 1 direct flight a day from Durban

Johannesburg is the gateway to South Africa via OR Tambo International Airport - the largest airport in Africa. Connecting flights via Johannesburg include:

VENUE CAPACITY


The primary meeting venues in Bloemfontein include:

- The Sand du Plessis Theatre a modern performing-arts centre near The Loch Logan Waterfront with a seating capacity of 2 000
- The City Hall Auditorium has capacity for 1 000 seats
- The University of the Free State has 3 plenary spaces with seating capacity of up to 4 000 each and a large number of meeting rooms

Alternate function venues include Loch Logan Island on the Waterfront, the Oliewenhuis Museum, the Oude Kraal Country Estate (known for authentic local cuisine) and the Fire Brigade Museum.
