waZulu-Natal is rich in its diversity of people and experiences. The province has "something" which offers visitors leisure, cultural and action adventures ranging from the bush, the berg, the battlefields, the beaches to the "Big Five" wildlife.

Styled as the Zulu Kingdom, KwaZulu-Natal has incentive activities which are varied and numerous, in the setting of magnificent vistas and modern facilities, and conducted by operators of the highest standard who are able to create itineraries to suit a wide variety of requirements.

It's a kingdom where the "Spirit of Summer" flourishes all year round. KwaZulu-Natal is one of South Africa's most important tourism provinces and is an area renowned for its conservation efforts, natural attractions, pre-historic and historical sites.

Two excellent examples of incentive programmes which this province can offer are, firstly, an itinerary that includes some of the excellent 4- to 5-star hotels of Durban with some of Africa's best spas on the Midlands Meander and the uKhahlamba Drakensberg Park.

The Drakensberg mountains are renowned for rock art evidence of the early San people or Bushmen, and this was one of the reasons why it was declared a World Heritage site. It is also regarded as one of the world's most important examples of an erosional mountain.

Some of KwaZulu-Natal's most fascinating historical sites are the battlefields of Blood River, Isandlwana, Rorke's Drift, Talana, Colenso and Spionkop. These are all found in close vicinity that this magnificent mountain range.

One of the most exciting elements

of such a programme includes a "helicopter flip" over some of the highest peaks at the top of the "Berg" which includes sipping a glass of champagne at the edge of the mountain's escarpment.

The Durban component of this programme can include a visit to the Inanda Heritage Route. This includes a visit to **Mahatma Gandhi's** Ashram in Phoenix, This route also includes the Ohlange Educational Institute and home of Rev **John Dube**, the first president of the African National Congress.

This is the site where **Nelson Mandela** cast his first vote and went on to report, to Rev Dube at his gravesite, which is also found in the grounds of this Institute that "we are finally free". This symbolically also represented the end of former President Mandela's "long walk to freedom".

Another fascinating element of such a programme could be a visit to the Victoria Street market and the Warwick Triangle markets. This is a rich example of business practices of the biggest Indian population concentrations outside mainland India, to the arts and crafts of the famous Zulu people.

We are also proud of our "beach culture" that is influenced by a range of world-class beaches, internationallyrecognised surf spots and shark diving reefs. These can be experienced just to the north and south of Durban at sites such as "Aliwal Shoal".

This scuba diving site is regarded as one of the top 10 shark diving experiences in the world.

Close by is the famous Oriba Gorge, which includes one of the third most significant "bungi swings" on the globe.

These Durban experiences can also be weaved into a second incentive programme which includes the iSimangaliso Wetland Park World Heritage sites, game reserves such as Hluhluwe-iMfolozi, South Africa's oldest game reserve where the white rhino was saved from extinction; and Tembe Elephant Park, which reportedly has the biggest elephant in Africa.

Some of Africa's finest private game reserves, such as Phinda and Thanda, can be used as excellent bases to savour these experiences and other experiences such as turtle spotting, whale watching and diving the reefs off Sodwana Bay.

Sodwana Bay's reefs are the southernmost coral reefs of Africa and one of the world's top 10 diving sites.

This rich heritage and tourism environment will assist in ensuring your incentive delegates not only have a rich, meaningful incentive, but an experience which will extend their knowledge of, and broader understanding of, this region and its diverse resources.

Culturally speaking, KwaZulu-Natal is a mix of Zulu, Indian and colonial influences, with each heritage reflected in historical and cultural trails, architecture, township cuisine and Durban's fine Indian curries.

recently had a meeting with a few key players in the MICE tourism sector in KwaZulu-Natal and I was pleasantly surprised by the enthusiasm among them.

KwaZulu-Natal really needs more credit than what is currently given by industry peers.

We, as DMCs all know that incentive groups focus on the "sea and safari" combo, which inevitably includes a private lodge safari experience in the north and Cape Town in the south.

Well, guess what? KwaZulu-Natal has safari, sea and mountains While most incentive groups might go for the classic South African programme on a first round, there is no reason why they shouldn't consider a second trip to South Africa, but into a different region with completely different offerings.

of unique experiences for all types of MICE groups and events. Game lodge offerings have expanded over recent years and can accommodate from tight budgets right up to superb luxury experiences.

New hotels and venues have mushroomed and old ones renovated back to former glory.

There certainly is no lack of historical experiences. Dating back more than 200 years, the Zulu Kingdom is firmly set in the history books.

Then we had the Anglo Boer War towards the end of the 19th Century, with the Battlefields making for some interesting discoveries. No visit to Durban would be complete without a smattering of civil rights activist **Mahatma Ghandi**, not to mention a taste of real Durban curry.

From an adventure angle, it is "Adrenaline Junkie Paradise", along with many athletic events taking place in the province each year.

Disciplines include the Comrades Marathon, regular international surfing contests, the Dusi Canoe marathon and the Midmar Mile swimming contest, to mention but a few.

t has been years since I visited the South Coast of Kwa Zulu Natal. Once upon a time it was the hub of South African holiday makers and fell out of favour for a number of years.

A few months ago I returned on a familiarisation trip, having heard some positive noises about developments in the region. I was pleasantly surprised with what I found. Many of the "old favourites" have been refurbished and restored to their former glory and more in the process. Margate even boasts a brand new hotel – The Desroches - with elegant conference space and in the process of expanding into small convention centre, as well as a great new Sky Bar with capacity for up to 500 guests, great for cocktail events and welcome parties.

Wild Coast Sun near Port Edward, was refurbished last year and still offers the largest conference space in the region with capacity for up to 900 guests.

The brand new Oribi Gorge Lodge is breath taking with only 6 luxury suites overlooking the gorge. The nearby Ziplining operation offers one of the highest and longest ziplines in the world

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Markets of Warwick tour adds value to City of Durban

Arkets of Warwick tour is a 2,5- hour walking tour through nine distinct markets in Warwick Junction. Warwick Junction lies on the edge of Durban's inner city and is the primary public transport interchange in the city with the confluence of rail, taxi and bus transport, accommodating an average of 460 000 commuters, and at least 6 000 street vendors in these markets.

Markets to be visited include the Muthi (herb), Brook Street, Early Morning, Victoria Street, Berea Station, Music Bridge, Lime and Impepho, Beads and Bovine Head markets.

Tours are guided by trained informal traders and a Traders Against Crime (TAC) member. Visitors will be able to experience the vitality and energy in this unique South African urban space and the value it gives the City of Durban.

Tours are run twice daily except Sundays. Booking is essential. Tour time(s): 9:30–12:00 and 13:00–15:30 (approx 3km walk). Tours start and end at Victoria Street Market, located in 151 Bertha Mkhize Street (formerly Victoria Street), Durban.

Underground parking is available from this market. Meeting spot's outside the Coffee Shop area inside the Victoria Street Market, on the ground floor. Cost: R100 per person and group bookings of eight people and more, fee is discounted to R70 per person. Children under 12 years are free of charge when accompanied by a minimum of two adults.

Durban is a seaside city with Blue Flag beaches and entertainment and activities of all varieties. You can also explore the fascinating traditional Zulu culture at an authentic cultural village.

his is the Zulu Kingdom – a heady cultural, historical and natural mix of attractions. The province is known for its particularly good weather (320 days of sunshine per year) as well as two UNESCO World Heritage Sites, fantastic Blue Flag beaches, majestic mountains, rolling midlands and incredible wild places that boast the Big Five and so much more.

KwaZulu-Natal has an incredible cultural heritage. Once home to the legendary King Shaka, this province has one of the largest Indian communities outside India and also has a strong British colonial heritage.

You'll see evidence of this mixed heritage on the streets of Durban and Pietermaritzburg, two major hubs of the province.

Durban is known as "South Africa's Miami" with its glorious Golden Mile. The Durban beachfront is a popular KwaZulu-Natal tourist attraction. Walk the entire length of this beautiful stretch of beach, from Moses Mabhida Stadium to uShaka Marine World, a world-class aquarium and dolphinarium.

Have a drink at the superb Moyos cocktail bar on the pier. Pay a visit to Wilson's Wharf, catch a sunset Durban harbour cruise and explore local cultural markets – in particular the historic Victoria Street Market.

The city has a host of fantastic restaurants, pubs, clubs and world-class hotels spread out across its Golden Mile and Durban's Florida Road is the spot for fun and entertainment into the wee hours of the morning.

Heading away from the bright city lights of Durban along the North Coast, you'll find the "Big Five" game reserves and wonders of the iSimangaliso Wetlands Park (a UNESCO World Heritage site).

To the east of Durban, you'll find the uKhahlamba Drakensberg Park (another UNESCO World Heritage site) boasting the highest mountain range in Africa – next to Kenya's Kilimanjaro.

There are the lush Midlands with fantastic guest houses and pubs and the historic hallowed grounds of the KwaZulu-Natal battlefields with fascinating legends and stories of heroes long gone, but definitely not forgotten.

Durban is no stranger to hosting major events. Durban's conference and meeting venues include the renowned Albert Luthuli International Convention Centre, which has won numerous international awards. There are also a range of fantastic business hotels, boutique establishments, meetings venues and conference centres worth investigating in this fun-loving province.

EXTREME ADVENTURE ACTIVITIES

In the market for some insane, crazy fun? Just for laughs, hop over the edge of a football stadium (the Moses Mabhida Big Rush Big Swing) or hurl yourself down a waterfall (Oribi Gorge Wild Gorge Swing). For the less brave, Moses Madhiba also offers a stunning view of the city if you take a ride on the skycar.

Shark enthusiasts, visit the KwaZulu-Natal Sharks Board, a world authority on sharks and shark protection, or bite the bullet – go shark cage diving in Durban, or simply scuba dive among the sharks, if you dare, at Aliwal Shoal.

MORE SERENE ACTIVITIES The Drakensberg

The Dutch settlers called it the Drakensberg (dragon mountains) and the Zulu, the uKhahlamba (barrier of spears). There's no doubt about it, Southern Africa's highest mountain range is certainly impressive. An area of stunning natural beauty, the uKhahlamba Drakensberg Park is KwaZulu-Natal's second World Heritage site. Enjoy a helicopter flip over the Drakensberg and when you land, champagne on arrival with breathtaking views.



The Valley of 1000 Hills

Some 40 kilometres inland from Durban, you will find the spectacular Valley of 1000 Hills. Take in the scenery, visit the Phezulu Safari Park and Cultural Centre, or take a ride on the Umgeni steam train.

North Coast Beaches

Travel northwards from Durban, up the North Coast, and explore the many fantastic beaches from Umhlanga, Ballito, Salt Rock, Sheffield Beach, and beyond.

Surf and Safari

The area known as Maputoland stretches from Swaziland in the west to the Indian Ocean in the east, in the northern region of KwaZulu-Natal. While other regions might offer a chance to see Africa's big game, or laze about on fabulous beaches, Maputoland offers the best of both worlds – the authentic African safari experience and a great beach experience, in one. What better reason to put Maputoland on your list of KwaZulu-Natal places to visit?

Whale Watching

If you'd prefer an encounter with a gentle giant, consider a KwaZulu-Natal whale tour. From May to September, Humpback and Southern Right Whales migrate from the colder waters of the Antarctic up to their breeding grounds off the coast of Mozambique. During this time, whales can be spotted all along the KwaZulu-Natal coastline.

Game Reserves

A tour of KwaZulu-Natal wouldn't be complete without a safari. Get up close and personal with Africa's "Big Five" at one of KwaZulu-Natal's game reserves, including Hluhluwe-Umfolozi and iThala Game Reserves (managed by KZN-Ezemvelo Wildlife) and Phinda Private Game Reserve. Those who enjoy experiencing the African wild at its wildest will enjoy the fact that game reserves in this area (Maputoland) are less crowded than the more popular game reserves of the Mpumalanga lowveld.

Lake St Lucia

St Lucia Estuary (Lake St Lucia) is found in the massive iSimangaliso Wetland Park (Greater St Lucia Wetland Park), and is one of two World Heritage sites in KwaZulu-Natal. St Lucia is a paradise for birdwatchers and fishermen alike. Just watch out for crocodiles and hippos.

Cape Vidal

Travelling north-east from the town of St Lucia, you will come to the scenic and unspoiled bay, Cape Vidal. Here, you can access both African game on the eastern shores of St Lucia Estuary and marine life on the coast. For those who enjoy a history mystery – the Dorothea shipwreck, which ran aground in 1898 and was said to be carrying the Kruger Millions, is reputed to lie somewhere near Cape Vidal.

Sodwana Bay

Carry on north, up the coast from Cape Vidal and find another wild gem – Sodwana Bay. This area boasts spectacular coral reefs and an abundance of colourful marine life, all in a protected National Marine Reserve. Go snorkelling, diving, hiking and horse riding, or simply enjoy the beaches. A highlight, though, must be going on a turtle tour – loggerhead, leatherback and green turtles all breed here between November and February.

Shakaland

For a Zulu cultural experience like no other, visit Shakaland – a larger-than-life Zulu village adapted from the sets of local television series' Shaka Zulu and John Ross.

The Battlefields Route

It's hard to imagine that the now tranquil African bushveld of the Battlefields Route was once the setting for a plethora of bloody battles, from the Battle of Blood River (between the Boers and the Zulu), to the Anglo-Zulu Wars (between the British and the
